The Jane Brook Community Assoc in partnership with National Lifestyle Villages and Echo Intelligent will plant 10,000 native trees along the banks of Jane Brook on Friday 1st July 2011. Many parts of the creek have been degraded over the years and after an extensive weed spraying program to eradicate noxious weeds we are ready to bring the Brook back to its former glory. #### CONDITIONS

- 1. Judges will view each garden from the street only. Backyards not considered.
- 2. Front and side streetscapes are eligible.
- 3. Streetscape includes the length of the garden, house and driveway as seen from the street.
- 4. A garden includes the verge.
- 5. Apartments and balconies can enter the small garden category.
- 6. Residential and non-residential sites are eligible, also new gardens and established gardens.
- 7. Judges will inspect the gardens at any time during the last week of October & 1st week in November

Judges will be asking themselves the following questions:

- 1. Does the garden add impact to the street scene?
- 2. Has the gardener made good use of the site's shape and limitations?
- 3. Is there a WOW factor? Would passers-by be likely to pause in admiration?
- 4. Does the garden exhibit good use of colour, plant texture and shape?
- 5. Are there features of interest such as pots, pebbles, water features, furniture?
- 6. Are other garden features such as the letterbox, doormat, benches and driveway well maintained and in harmony with the garden?

#### **AWARDS**

Certificates will be presented in each category to Winners and Runners-up.

In addition there will be lots of merit awards to encourage people who are making an effort to keep their gardens attractive.
